**FROM THE  
EDITORIAL  
BOARD**

This past summer saw one change in *CJP*'s Editorial Board. Catherine Wilson, who has been the journal's early modern philosophy expert since 1994, has moved on to become editor of *History of Philosophy Quarterly*. Catherine, who will complete her *CJP* work by editing the 1999 Supplementary Volume on *Civilization and Oppression*, brought a distinctively historical perspective to the editor's deliberations. We are grateful for her contributions and wish her well in her new position. She is replaced on the *CJP* Board by Thomas M. Lennon (University of Western Ontario), who is likewise internationally known for his work on the early modern period.

This summer also saw the journal's triennial grant application to the Social Sciences and Humanities Research Council of Canada, part of which involves statistics on the journal's operations. In the 1995-97 period, 25% of papers submitted to *CJP* and 28% of those accepted were from Canadian authors; 75% of submissions and 72% of acceptances were from non-Canadians. Over that period the journal used 309 different referees.
