A collection of essays by sociologists and historians; H. P. Dreitzel, "Theorielose Geschichte und geschichtslose Soziologie," is original; the others have appeared elsewhere.

## NEWS

The Militärgeschichtliche Mitteilungen, published by the Militärgeschichtliches Forschungsamt in Freiburg, has issued a sixty-page Register to its first ten issues (1967–71). The index covers not only the large number of articles, documents, and reports published in the journal, but also the book reviews and the briefer Anzeigen, which cover some periodical articles as well as books. Since there is a comprehensive subject index (mainly chronological) in addition to the alphabetical index, the index serves not only as a guide to the journal, but as a general guide to recent research in military history, broadly defined.

The Institute of German Studies, Indiana University, announces two new publications: *Teaching Postwar Germany in America* (see "Books Received"), and *A Bibliography of German Studies*, 1945–1971 (Indiana University Press, \$12.50), an interdisciplinary bibliography on postwar Germany.

Relatives and friends of Klaus W. Epstein (1926–67), the author of a biography of Matthias Erzberger (1959), of The Genesis of German Conservatism (1966), and of Geschichte und Geschichtswissenschaft im 20. Jahrhundert (1972), established a Memorial Fund in 1968. It provides a stipend each year for an American or Canadian advanced student, graduate or postgraduate, preferably specializing in modern German history, for study at a West German university or for archival research in Germany. The scholarship amount per month would be approximately \$330 (DM 1,200) plus cost of travel to Germany and return. Inquiries should be sent to the Alexander von Humboldt–Stiftung (Schillerstrasse 12, 53 Bonn–Bad Godesberg 1, German Federal Republic), which administers the stipend. Blanks for application will be sent upon request. March 30, 1973, will be the deadline for the receipt of applications for the academic year 1973–74.
