'What is Philosophy?' This question, more often put than answered, is very difficult to answer, even for the philosopher. However, the author of this work has tried to give an answer to this question in ten short lectures, delivered on the 'Special Program' of the Bavarian Radio during the summer of 1958. He did not try to do this by means of long historical surveys, the time of twenty-seven minutes for each lecture being too short, nor by means of thorough abstract speculations, which might intimidate the uninformed listener. But starting from some words which everyone uses daily, like truth, law, man, society, etc., he introduces his listeners (his readers now) into the field of philosophy. What seemed to be unreal and sophisticated is now presented in a way very closely connected with every-day life.
