

### ETHICS, SCIENCE, AND DEMOCRACY THE PHILOSOPHICAL WORK OF ABRAHAM EDEL

*Irving Louis Horowitz and H. Standish Thayer, editors*

This volume, modeled after those published in *The Library of Living Philosophers*, attempts to provide a coherent statement of the work of Abraham Edel in moral and political theory, and on the impact of his work on such diverse areas as education, law, and social science. The methodological element of Edel's work is to see ethical and social theory in the full context of human life; specifically how twentieth-century modes of analysis impact classical concerns about right and wrong, good and evil.

The volume is tightly integrated from start to finish, and has the benefit of Edel's thoughtful and thoroughgoing response to critics. In short, while this work is a tribute to the work of a scholar, it aims to serve as a basic guide through the labyrinthian world of contemporary ethical theory and social practice.

The editors of this volume, former students and now colleagues of Edel, are *Irving Louis Horowitz*, Hannah Arendt Professor of Sociology and Political Science at Rutgers University; and *H. Standish Thayer*, Research Professor of Philosophy at the City College of the City University of New York.

What is meant by *education*? How are educational institutions and processes evaluated, and how can they be improved? What curriculum is best? How are philosophy and education related? Abraham Edel answers these questions in the course of exploring education. He considers the problems of educational philosophy under conditions of rapid social change in the twentieth century and argues that too many of the traditional approaches to education were set in an effort to delineate a permanent structure rather than to work out ways of handling rapid change.
