All references for this volume are presented in full bibliographic detail in the footnotes, including both printed and archival primary sources, interviews, web pages, and other nonprinted information, and secondary published sources (books and articles). In this selected bibliography, we have compiled a selection of published material from the references that we find particularly illustrative of the main thrust of the volume. The selection focuses on relatively recent work, with a preference for books, on the role of Stockholm and Sweden, on the UN 1972 Stockholm Conference, on the rise of global environmental governance and its relation to Earth System science, and on the significance of cities as knowledge-dense hubs of policy innovation. In addition, this list includes some of the central theoretical and conceptual work that has been important for us.

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
