Cyrillic alphabets should be transliterated according to the Library of Congress system, without diacritical marks. Manuscripts should not exceed 30 pages in length (including notes). In all matters of style, the practice recommended by K. L. Turabian, *A Manual for Writers*, 4th ed., is normally followed. Book reviews should give complete bibliographic description. Unsolicited book reviews are not accepted.
