A report *Impact of Depression* resulted from a multidisciplinary panel, consisting of professionals from fields such as psychiatry, general practice, health economics, occupational health and patient groups, who each highlighted the impact of depression from their own standpoints. *Challenging Community Care Decisions* is a blueprint from the Public Law Project designed to help lawyers and voluntary agencies advise people who are experiencing community care problems.
