### **Course on Research Methodology and Statistics**

A Course on Research Methodology and Statistics, sponsored jointly by the Research Committee of the Royal College of Psychiatrists and the Department of Psychiatry at Manchester University, will be held at the University Hospital of South Manchester on 5/6 and 26/27 November 1977. The Course will consist of lectures and seminars on research methods, together with exercises in statistics and the writing of research protocols.

### **Midland Courses in Group Work and Family Therapy**

Two further courses of lectures and group sessions, organized in conjunction with the Institute of Group Analysis, are to be held at Leicester General Hospital on 30 Tuesday afternoons from 4 October–11 December and 10 January–21 March, and at Littlemore Hospital, Oxford on 30 Thursday afternoons from 6 October–15 December, 5 January–16 March, and 6 April–25 May.
