These areas represent ANTHROPOLOGY, ARCHAEOLOGY, ART and ARCHITECTURE, BIBLIOGRAPHY, CLASSICS, EDUCATION, FOLKLORE, HISTORY, LIBRARY SCIENCE, LINGUISTICS, LITERATURE and MODERN LANGUAGES, MASS COMMUNICATION, MATHEMATICS, MUSIC, PHILOSOPHY, POLITICAL SCIENCE, PROGRAMMING, PSYCHOLINGUISTICS, SOCIAL PSYCHOLOGY, SOCIOLOGY, SPEECH, STATISTICS, THEATER, and TRANSLATION.

This book is intended for readers without specialist training in planning who become concerned with regional planning in developing countries. It seeks to make clear the kind of thinking necessary in all regional planning, the proper role of research, some of the problems of securing and examining evidence, and the question of the time element. The treatment throughout is broad rather than technical. The aim is to elucidate principles, so that the reader will know how to derive maximum benefit from specialised techniques. Successive chapters then deal with problems of almost universal occurrence such as population growth, urbanisation, industrial changes, and the evolution of transport. Finally, the book discusses the form of the plan, action subsequent to its preparation and the need for follow-up plans to take further the process started by the first.
