





## **INNOVATIONS IN GLOBAL GOVERNANCE FOR THE NEW MILLENNIUM**

### **Program**

The Academic Council on the United Nations System (ACUNS) and the American Society of International Law (ASIL) together with the Centre for the Study of Globalisation and Regionalisation (CSGR) at the University of Warwick are sponsoring the tenth in a series of summer workshops on international organization studies to be held at the University of Warwick, United Kingdom, from 30 July to 11 August 2000. This workshop is designed for junior faculty, practitioners from policy circles and civil society, post-doctoral scholars, and advanced graduate students.

The purposes of this workshop are to enhance professional development in international organization studies, encourage new directions in international organization research, establish and strengthen contacts amongst legal and international relations scholars and UN practitioners, and stimulate teaching and research in international organization studies.

The 2000 workshop will be directed by Christine Chinkin of the London School of Economics, Jan Aart Scholte of the University of Warwick, and Paul Wapner of American University's School of International Service.

The theme for this year's workshop is "Innovations in Global Governance for the New Millennium." World politics is increasingly marked by global problems that require (at least in part) global institutional solutions. Conflict management, economic prosperity, ecological sustainability, human rights, cultural identity, and social cohesion have all become issues for which national and local regulatory arrangements are not by themselves sufficient. A principal challenge for the new century is to

build modes of governance that are adequate to provide security, justice, ecological well-being, and democracy in a more global world. The 2000 workshop will explore the concepts and instruments that are needed to handle global problems in an effective and equitable manner. What new understandings of law and governance might be required in the face of globalization? What new legal and institutional mechanisms (local, national, regional, and global) can steer global developments in desired directions? What roles might business and civil society play? How can the United Nations, in particular, contribute to these innovations?

The workshop will consist of presentations by and interaction with experts in the field, exercises and discussions focusing on developing greater links between academics and practitioners, skills development in teaching, research, and writing on international organization, and participant presentations.


