

and fascism. And with this acceptance was to come the final degradation of the Hegelian view of "the State" and of "Eternal Peace".

How far is it then possible, I wonder, for the German state of today to recapture that spirit of idealism and of national identity that Hegel sought to create, or is it a question that no longer has a bearing for modern Germany?
