

**Proofs.** The corresponding author will receive, by email, page proofs for checking which they are required to return within three days of receipt. Textual changes in proof cannot normally be countenanced and the publisher reserves the right to charge authors for excessive correction of non-typographical errors.

**Offprints.** A .pdf proof of the published article will be emailed to the first author unless otherwise requested; printed copies may be purchased if ordered at proof stage on the form provided.
