### THE COLLEGE OF SURGEONS OF AUSTRALASIA.

### PREHISTORIC EVIDENCE OF NASAL ABNORMALITIES.

Dr F. A. Burton, F.A.C.S., has had the opportunity of studying in the Museum of Man, at San Diego, California, a large number of prehistoric skulls collected by the members of an expedition sent to Peru for the purpose of obtaining anthropological material. His papers incorporating his observations are full of interest, and a brief reference may be made here to what he has written upon deviations of the nasal septum.

It was customary among the Incas of Peru to produce artificial distortion of the cranium in infancy by the application of compression-bands. In the collection examined, 33 crania had been artificially deformed, and of these 20 or 60 per cent. had deviated nasal septa. Of 152 undeformed crania, 40 or 26 per cent. presented a similar alteration in the position of the septum. In the majority there was a simple bowing of that structure or bowing associated with a ridge or crest.

Dr Burton draws the following conclusion:—"The incentive leading to this investigation was a desire, or rather a curiosity, to study the relation between septal deviation and development of the cranial box, and I believe that I am now able to show that the development of the cranium is a decided factor in the etiology of this condition. The figures indicate that alteration in the development of the size and shape of the cranial cavity plays a major rôle in causing septal deviation, especially simple bowing, or bowing plus ridge, while simple ridges or spurs, which are rare, come from sources other than disturbed development of the head. In other words, the marked increase in frequency shown by the series of artificially deformed skulls over the series of undeformed ones must have a reason behind it and the explanation suggests itself that the constriction of the skull in these cases of artificial deformation exerted pressure from above downward, and that this force was added to the usual pressure from below upward. By the same process of reasoning, is it not obvious that the increased pressure against the floor of the cranial box is a productive factor in the increase in number of septal deviations?"

# Models of the Labyrinth



These models (King's College Hospital pattern) were devised by  
Mr A. H. CHEATLE  
and  
Mr NEGUS  
for teaching purposes  
and for investigating  
labyrinthine diseases.

The pointers on the Head frame lie parallel with the Frankfort plane, so that when the frame is on the head the models lie in correct orientation in all respects. The patient's head can be put in any position and the exact relations of each of the canals are seen; rotation and caloric tests can be carried out with the frame in position.
