Richard Neville, the 16th Earl of Warwick, was known as the Kingmaker for his central role in the Wars of the Roses. Warwick, a Yorkist at the outset of *The Third Part of King Henry VI*, switches his allegiance to the Lancastrian Henry VI after Edward marries Lady Elizabeth Grey, thwarting his plans for matching the king with the sister-in-law of the French king.
